HISTORY

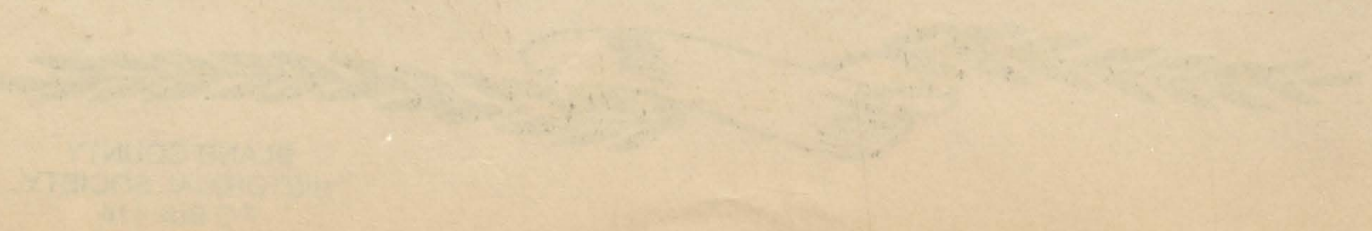

I will next visit the new high school which has been built at Nebo, Virginia. I see a new gymnasium and a new physical education teacher. She is Miss Ada Mae Hubble.

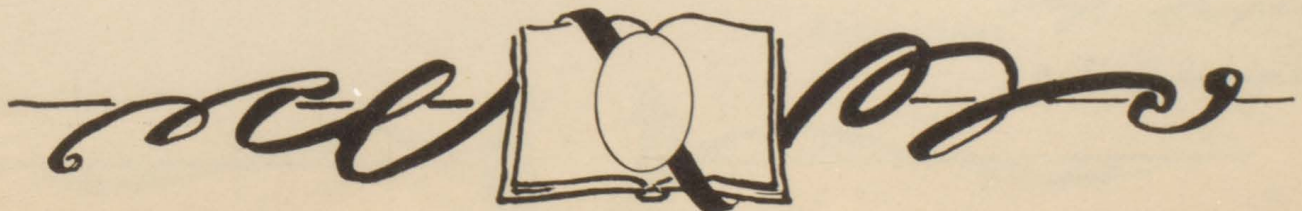
