There is another teacher. By George! It is the principal of Ceres High School, Betty Crabtree. Well, you gals, take good care of the children.

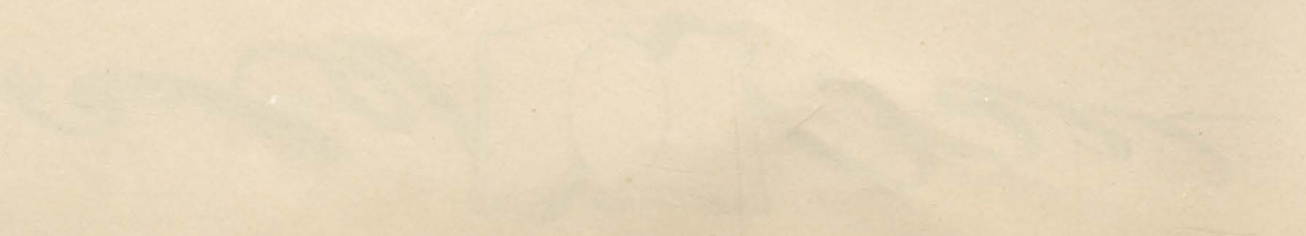
